Elements of a Quality School -- Based on

Based on data collected from teachers, parents, and community members from all across the state, the following are the things that people say would matter in the assessment of a quality school. How does your community's school measure up?

My community school/district's...

FUNDING

Class sizes are in compliance with state regulations, no exceptions or loopholes (1:20 for elementary schools, 1:140/6 hours for middle/high schools).

Teacher compensation meets or exceeds the regional average (current regional average: \$47,157, Oklahoma average: \$44,373).

Actively works to retain quality teachers and administrators.

Textbooks and teaching materials are consistently adopted every 5 years. Number of counselors meets state requirements (1:450 or prorated amount for schools with less than 250 students). Counselors are available for college/career planning and mental health services—not just scheduling and test coordinating.

Support staff includes at least one nurse and social worker.

Adequate numbers of custodians and cafeteria personnel.

Adequate bilingual personnel for parent/guardian communication.

Students and teachers have regular access to up-to-date classroom technology (computers, Smart Boards, hand held devices, projectors, etc.).

Campus has adequate teachers and resources for students with exceptionalities.

TESTING

Results from benchmark and testing data is used to guide instruction rather than label and punish students/teachers.

Testing results are received in a timely manner.

Feedback Given in VOICE Presentations

Testing procedures include exemptions for ELL students, emergencies, and trauma.

Remediation/intervention programs are timely, effective, and properly funded.

CURRICULUM

Offers a variety of fine art, music, theater, and performance arts classes/activities.

Offers physical education classes/activities in addition to athletics, general health, and

Students have several opportunities to participate in field trips and hands on learning activities.

Curriculum is geared to a "whole child" approach to instruction/learning rather than primarily focused on test subjects/scores.

Curriculum includes civics and character education (life skills).

Curriculum teaches students to think critically.

Extracurricular activities accommodate for diversity within the student body.

SCHOOL CLIMATE

Campus is safe/secure, and proper guest check in/out procedures are strictly enforced.

Teaching staff includes many teachers with advanced degrees and/or National Board certification.

Offers a variety of opportunities for parents to be involved with student's education/activities.

Administrators, teachers, parents, and community communicate openly and effectively with one another.

Offers opportunities for community outreach (partnerships, tutoring programs, etc.).





